

Christmas cheer for Northern Ireland Councils

Councils throughout Northern Ireland were celebrating some early Christmas cheer today after being named amongst the finalists for the first ever Northern Ireland Local Government Awards. The awards celebrate the best services, best officers and best councillors from Northern Ireland councils.

The awards have been brought about through collaboration between the Association for Public Service Excellence (APSE), Local Government Staff Commission NI (LGSC), Local Government Training (LGT), Northern Ireland Local Government Association (NILGA), Society of Local Authority Chief Executives NI (SOLACE NI) and the William Johnston Memorial Trust to help promote the sharing of best practice in public services.

APSE Chief Executive, Paul O'Brien said *"There has never been any doubt about the quality of the services provided by councils in Northern Ireland but they have not been as proactive as they might have been about sharing their achievements with others. That's what these awards are ultimately about"* He added *"Councils need to make the most of opportunities to tell local people about the quality of services they provide and to celebrate those officers and councillors who are committed to providing the best possible public services but who are often unsung local heroes"*

- The awards attracted 87 submissions from councils across Northern Ireland and the award judges were particularly impressed by the scope and quality of the submissions received
- The partners will come together again in 2009 to showcase the awards winners and finalists in a learning event as part of the process of self help between councils and to secure the awards in the local government calendar for future years.
- The award winners will be announced at a special Gala dinner hosted by NILGA on the 26 February at the Armagh City Hotel
- The winners will also be asked to speak about their services at other events run by the partners.
